
Monday nights from 5:00 p.m.—

Friday, August 5th the Tour of Utah Bicycle Race—5th Stage (from Antelope Island Park, North Ogden Divide, Trapper's Loop to Bountiful—114 miles) will tour through Fruit Heights City coming from the north, Hwy 89 & 200 North onto Mountain Road at approximately 2:20 p.m. Due to the speed of the bicyclists—anywhere between 20—28 mph, it won't take but ~15 minutes from the fastest to slowest for them to bicycle through. - Construction along Mountain Road is complete.
- Nicholls Park parking lot rebuild is complete.
- * Hwy. 89 West to Lloyd Rd. intersecting Green Rd.—installation of curb and gutter along south side of Green Rd begins.
- Country Way road improvements to be finished within 2 weeks.
- 1800 E. & Eastoaks storm drain placement to begin approximately August 1st.
- Hidden Springs Parkway, 1350 East, and City Hall parking lot should be complete at time of this publication.

Residents will need to be patient with the contractor as there will be water service and transportation delays. It is both the City's and the contractor's intent to keep roads open during the project, but expect delays in travel time. Residents are being asked to plan their day and schedules accordingly.



WATER CONSERVATION District News

Our water supply is still looking pretty good, especially compared to the last few years. We have three reservoirs spilling (Causey, Pineview, and Smith and Morehouse) and are expecting Echo and Wanship to fill as well. The reservoirs along the Ogden River drainage are at around 80% capacity collectively.

We feel that conservation is still imperative even though our water supply is promising. We are going to need a few years of good snow pack and precipitation to fully recover from the last four years of drought. Past years of drought combined with increasing demand due to increasing population make conservation efforts as important as ever.
