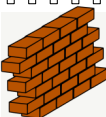

As we enter the fall and winter months, the city is strongly encouraging residents who have retaining walls to take some time to inspect them. Often times a summer of watering has unknowingly caused erosion or settling in the walls which can result in their failure. If it appears that there are changes in the integrity of a retaining wall, residents are asked to contact a Geo-Technical Engineer to conduct a more detailed inspection of the wall. As property owners, you are responsible for retaining walls on your property and for the damage that may occur as a result of improper maintenance.
