CULINARY WATER, STORM DRAIN and TRASH RATE CHANGES

Culinary water base rate (maintenance) fee increases from \$32.20 to \$32.40. Water per thousand gallon increases from \$1.05 to \$1.10. Storm Drain increases from \$13.25 to \$13.75. First trash can and service rates from \$11.98 to \$12.10; 2nd can from \$7.75 to \$7.55; and green can from \$5.85 to \$5.54. These changes were approved by the City Council on May 16, 2017 and will be reflected on the August 1st billing.

HERO WITH FUR LIVES IN FRUIT HEIGHTS

Mazzie, a Contract Working Dog (CWD) and Narcotics Detection Dog (NDD) was retired and adopted by Jim and Linda Crismer of Fruit Heights. Mazzie is a year old German shepherd who served in Kuwait as a NDD at the airport. He was a CWD which means he did the same work as a Military Working Dog, but was owned by a private company that contracted him to the Kuwaiti government.

Mazzie arrived in Houston on October 31, 2015, after a 36-hour flight from Kuwait, through France. Mazzie suffers from post-traumatic stress syndrome (PTSD). Upon his arrival in the U.S., he weighed only 60 pounds and with the loving care of his foster mom, Karen Dodd, he gained 20 pounds and learned how to be a pet.

On March 7, 2016, Bill and Judy Weimann, friends of the Crismers, picked up Mazzie from his foster mom in Houston and drove him to Amarillo where Jim and Linda traveled to get him. Mazzie then made the long trip to Utah, arriving at his new home March 9th.

Mazzie and 9 other narcotic dogs were saved by Mission K9 Rescue of Houston. Mission K9 Rescue is an amazing organization whose purpose is "Serving Our Nation's Working Dogs". They operate solely on contributions by private donors.

The War Dog Memorial Colorado is a developing project in Colorado Springs to honor working dogs of the U.S. Wade and Ruby Ridpath, founders of the Memorial, played an important role in Mazzie's adoption by the Crismers.

You are welcome to visit Mazzie at his new home. If you see him being walked through the city, please stop and say hello. Mazzie is a gentle boy who is learning to trust all the new people he meets.
