SUMMER FUN.

Summer is finally here and with it comes soccer, baseball, family vacations and yes, road construction. We have recently started three capital improvement projects including the final phase of the Mountain Road upgrade project. This phase includes installation of a new storm drain and complete re-paving of the road from Nicholls Road to the City Hall. We are also using funds from the new street maintenance enterprise fund to install crack sealant and chip and seal overlays to enhance and extend the life of our streets based on our long term management plan. We recognize that these projects do have a temporary adverse impact on the residents but our infrastructure needs these projects and we all benefit from them in the long run. We encourage everyone to be courteous and patient as we complete these important projects. Also please remember to drive "slow" in the construction zones.

Although the elections are still several months away, a recent change to the State election laws will affect the way Fruit Heights City holds our Caucus meetings. Many residents may not be aware of this but Fruit Heights City is the only City in Davis County that continues to hold an electoral caucus meeting instead of a primary election. This year our caucus meeting is scheduled for August 15, 2017 at 7:00 pm at the Fruit Heights City hall. The change of state law will require those individuals who desire to run for the two open council seats and the Mayor seat to file a declaration of candidacy at the City offices between June 1, 2017 and June 7, 2017. In years past, we were able to nominate candidates at the caucus meeting and now we will not be able to do so. Please put the caucus on your calendar and if you have a desire to run for public office please file your declaration by June 7th. Our Monday night Food Truck event is in the second season and this year we have planned some additional fun as we will be having movie nights and music added to the great food and fun. These activities are listed on the City web site. Please bring a blanket and come join with us at the City building every Monday night.

For the third straight year the Tour of Utah will be racing through our City. Please make plans on August 4th to watch as the Tour cyclist's race along Mountain Road towards the finish line in Bountiful. The start of the Davis county leg will begin in Layton and finish in Bountiful. This is a great opportunity to witness professional bike racing in our own back yard. Many of the teams come from the Tour de France to compete in this great event.

Founders Day is fast approaching. August 5th will be the date for this year's Fruit Heights City Founder's Day. If you haven't attended before you are missing out on one of the best community events of the year. Please plan to attend with your family and friends. CULINARY WATER, STORM DRAIN and TRASH RATE CHANGES

Culinary water base rate (maintenance) fee increases from \$32.20 to \$32.40. Water per thousand gallon increases from \$1.05 to \$1.10. Storm Drain increases from \$13.25 to \$13.75. First trash can and service rates from \$11.98 to \$12.10; 2nd can from \$7.75 to \$7.55; and green can from \$5.85 to \$5.54. These changes were approved by the City Council on May 16, 2017 and will be reflected on the August 1st billing.

2017-2018 CITY BUDGET

The Fruit Heights City Council is currently discussing the 2017-2018 Operating Budget.



On June 20, 2017 the Final Operating Budget will be reviewed and adopted by the City Council during a regularly scheduled City Council Meeting. A copy of the budget will be made available for public view after it is adopted.
