

## CITIZEN'S ACADEMY

# Next Citizen's Academy: Tuesday June 5th, 2018 6:00-7:00 pm at City Building

### SIDEWALK SAFETY

Recently I was invited to walk around a neighborhood and look at some challenges that affected individuals who have limited mobility; this was a very eye opening experience. Many of these challenges are not only problematic for people in wheelchairs but also for young kids on bikes, skateboards, scooters, or for parents pushing strollers and couples walking around the neighborhoods.

As residents of Fruit Heights, we all like to take pride in our landscaping and how our yards and neighborhoods look. The biggest problem that I have seen as I have paid more attention to accessibility is the trees and shrubs that overhang the sidewalks. Trees are a popular landscaping improvement that many of us make and many residents have planted nice trees in the park strip. Once these trees mature the root systems cause the sidewalks to lift, creating an additional hazard that can cause injury to people that use the sidewalks.

As residents, it's important that you pay particular attention to the vegetation that has been planted out along the sidewalks and streets in front of your homes. It is your responsibility to make sure that your trees and shrubs are properly trimmed back and away from the edge of the sidewalk and that the trees are trimmed up above the sidewalk a minimum of 10' and 14' above the city street. If you have noticed that the roots from a tree have lifted the sidewalk and have caused a tripping hazard it is the property owner's responsibility to have the tree and roots removed.

Because safety and accessibility is important, the City is willing to work with property owners in a coordinated effort to increase safety and reduce hazards.
