While the current General Plan has been carefully followed, it was last updated in 2005. Since then, Davis County has experienced unprecedented growth. The City has hired an outside consultant, Landmark Design, to develop an update to the General Plan.

The plan will establish a clear vision for the City that balances current strengths with future needs and desires. This vision will then be translated into a complete, long-reaching General Plan that addresses land use, housing, transportation, economic development and more. WINTER PARKING

From November 1 - April 1, winter parking rules apply regardless of snow on the ground. It is illegal to park on streets between Midnight and 8 a.m., or during snowfall when plows are in operation. The Davis County Sheriff's Office has started issuing warnings and citations.

UDOT CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Lloyd Road Closure: Lloyd Road will be closed between Main Street and 1175 South for approximately one month while crews replace the water line. Area traffic should use Hidden Valley Drive as an alternate route during this work. The project should finish in January 2022.

Nicholls Road Area: Crews are rebuilding the center of U.S. 89 through the end of the year between Main Street and 400 North with the aim to shift northbound traffic to the center early in 2022 and begin full reconstruction activities on the east side.

Bridge work will also include ground improvements and use of large equipment through 2022. Area residents can expect ongoing noise, vibration and dust during the day while this work occurs.

Green Road Area: Significant utility work is ongoing for a number of services including irrigation, sewer, gas and storm drain on both sides of U.S. 89 on the frontage road as well as crossings underneath the highway through spring 2022. Area residents can expect ongoing noise, vibration and dust during the day while this work occurs.

Cleanup Projects: As UDOT works in and around Fruit Heights, areas requiring cleanup are created. UDOT will be back around to finish this cleanup work and complete any projects left incomplete, but UDOT's focus now is to get traffic shifted on U.S. 89 before weather becomes an issue.

ITEMS TO NOTE CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP:

Robinson Waste will collect live Christmas trees Friday, January 7, starting at 6 a.m.

HOLIDAY HOURS: City Hall will be closed Friday, Dec. 24 and Friday, Dec. 31. The offices will close at 12 p.m. on Thursday, Dec. 23 and Thursday, Dec. 30.

winter parking: Winter parking runs November 1 - April 1. No parking on streets overnight, or during snowfall.

GREEN WASTE CAN: Green waste service has ended for the season. Green cans may be used as an additional garbage can through March. Green service returns in April 2022.

PARK RESTROOMS: Public restrooms are closed and locked for the season.
