PLANNING COMMISSION SEEKS TWO NEW MEMBERS

COMMISSION MEMBERS OVERSEE ZONING ORDINANCES, LAND DEVELOPMENT, PLANNING

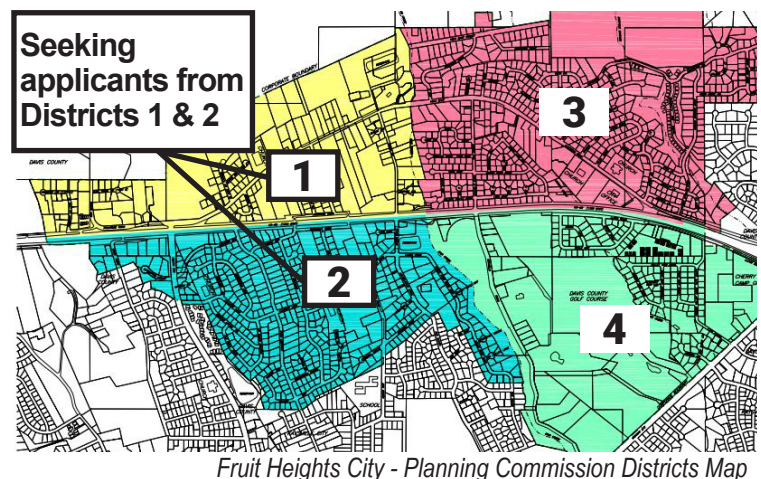
Have you ever been interested in shaping Fruit Heights and the City's future? This might be your chance. The planning commission oversees land use regulations which include zoning and subdivision issues. The commission also adopts any changes to the City's master plan.

The Fruit Heights City Planning Commission is made up of five voting members. For the purpose of the planning commission, Fruit Heights City is divided into four districts, with one planning commissioner representing and residing in each of those districts, plus one at-large commissioner.

Commissioners are appointed by the City Council, and generally serve a 3-year term. **The City Council is seeking applications for a commissioner from Districts 1 and 2. Applications must be submitted online, and are due by Monday, December 12.**

WINTER PARKING

From November 1 - April 1, winter parking rules apply regardless of
snow on the ground. It is illegal to park on streets between Midnight
and 8 a.m., or during snowfall when plows are in operation. The Davis
County Sheriff's Office has started issuing warnings and citations.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Mountain Road: Weber Basin Water Conservancy District replaced a
culinary water line that supplies water to northern Utah. This was not
a City project, but did involve work on City roads. As many residents
experienced, it took Weber Basin much longer to complete this project
than was anticipated. The water line work is complete, but due to
weather issues, crews are placing a temporary patch on Mountain Road
for the winter. This patch will be permanently repaired next spring.

Nicholls Road: The bridge over US-89 is opening to traffic in early
December. Pedestrian access is anticipated to open in mid-December. The
west frontage road will remain closed to traffic while crews complete the
connections at Laurelwood Drive and Lloyd Road through mid-December.

U.S. 89: As winter conditions allow, UDOT crews will continue work to
complete sidewalks, pedestrian ramps, curb and gutter, driveways and
other side-street items as materials, equipment and crews are available.
This work will extend through the spring. We appreciate continued
patience from area residents as UDOT works to address these items
neighborhood by neighborhood. If you have specific questions about

Quail Ridge Drive: Utility and road work are complete. Repair work to
landscaping will occur next spring.

Cherry Lane: Utility and road work are complete. Repair work to
landscaping will occur next spring.

WINTER PARKING: Winter
parking runs November 1 -
April 1. No parking on streets
overnight, or during snowfall.

GREEN WASTE CAN: Green
waste service has ended for the
season. Green cans may be
used as an additional garbage
can through March. Green
service returns in April 2023.

PARK RESTROOMS: Public
restrooms are closed and locked
for the season.
