GENERAL PLAN GUIDES CITY'S FUTURE

AFTER A YEAR OF COMMUNITY INPUT, UPDATED PLAN TAKES SHAPE

Fruit Heights, with its ideal location and friendly, quiet reputation, has made the city a very attractive and desirable place to live. As such, the city has experienced a great deal of growth and change in recent years, and now approaches a "build-out" condition. Although the existing General Plan has been a useful tool through much of this period, it has become outdated and requires an update to clarify a vision and goals for guiding the next chapter of the City's growth and development.

Updating the General Plan provides residents the opportunity to take a look at the community, determine what works or requires improvement, and to peer into the future and plan for anticipated changes. The General Plan typically has a life of five to ten years, although it establishes a future vision for twenty years or more.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

To best meet the needs of the community, residents were involved throughout the process of updating the General Plan. A public meeting was held on Nov. 18, 2021, followed by an online engagement period which utilized interactive maps and questionnaires.

Another public meeting was held on March 16, 2022. The input received from each meeting was wide-ranging, identifying several topics important to residents.

PUBLIC INVITED TO REVIEW PLAN AT OPEN HOUSE

Compiling input from residents, using existing plans and best practices, the Planning Team has completed the final draft of the updated General Plan. Residents are encouraged to drop in at City Hall to view the exhibit and submit comments during business hours Feb. 14-16, from 8 am-4:30 pm, or attend the open house event on Thursday, Feb. 16, from 5-7 pm. The Planning Team will be available at the Open House to answer questions.

As the 2023 legislative session kicked off, our youth leaders took part in mock committees, debated a bill, worked to design a city, heard from Governor and First Lady Cox, and had lunch with state legislators and City officials.

FIBER COMING TO FRUIT HEIGHTS

Connext is a locally owned company installing a fiber infrastructure in northern Utah. Connext is ready to begin the installation of fiber in Fruit Heights; starting in the southwest corner of the city in a few weeks.

In the coming months, residents should expect Connext crews to be working within the public utility easements which are located in front yards, park strips and city roads.

PROJECTS AROUND THE CITY

City Hall: A flood at City Hall, due to a failed part in a public drinking fountain located upstairs, has caused the closure to parts of the building. Administrative employees are working remotely when necessary, and all basement rentals have been cancelled. However, all work continues and the Council Chambers were not damaged. Council meetings will continue as scheduled. Residents may still call 801-546-0861, and they may still use the drop box located outside the building.

Mountain Road: If you've driven the north end of Mountain Road, you know it has seen better days. Weber Basin Water Conservancy District replaced a culinary water line that runs under Mountain Road. This was NOT a City project. As many residents experienced, it took Weber Basin much longer to complete this project than was anticipated, and they ran out of time to complete the repair work to the road. As of now, due to weather and temperature issues, Weber Basin can not give us an exact date for the final patch work, other than to say it will occur this spring.

U.S. 89 Projects: As winter conditions allow, UDOT crews will work to complete sidewalks, pedestrian ramps, curb and gutter, driveways and other side-street items as materials, equipment and crews are available. This work will extend through the spring. UDOT is working to address these items neighborhood by neighborhood. If you have specific questions about UDOT projects, contact UDOT at 888-752-8789.

Green Road to Nicholls Road: The west frontage road connection between Laurelwood Drive/Green Road and Nicholls Road has been postponed until paving can occur in the spring. Crews will continue to work on sidewalk, curb and gutter installation, placing road base and preparing to pave when conditions improve.

Quail Ridge Drive & Cherry Lane: Utility and road work are complete. Repair work to landscaping will occur in the spring.
