WINTER PARKING

From November 1 - April 1, winter parking rules apply regardless of snow on the ground. It is illegal to park on streets between Midnight and 8 am, or during snowfall when plows are in operation.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Raymond Road: Major work on the Raymond Road rebuild project is complete. A few remaining items will be completed in the spring.

Cul-de-sacs on Raymond Road: Work is scheduled to begin in spring of 2024 to mill and overlay new asphalt in each of the cul-de-sacs running along Raymond Road.

Terrace Drive: Work is scheduled to begin in spring of 2024 to mill and overlay new asphalt on Terrace Drive.

Connex Fiber: Connex is a locally owned company installing a fiber infrastructure in northern Utah. Connex began installing the network on the west side of the city in March 2023, and they continue to work throughout the city. Residents should expect Connex crews to be working within the public utility easements which are located in front yards, park strips and city roads. This will take several more months to complete. Once installed throughout the city, Connex will be another internet option available to residents, but it is not a required service.

CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP:

Christmas tree pick up day is Friday, Jan. 12, starting at 6 am.

HOLIDAY HOURS: City Hall will be closed Monday, Dec. 25 and Monday, Jan. 1.

WINTER PARKING: Winter parking runs Nov. 1 - April 1. No parking on streets overnight, or during snowfall.

GREEN WASTE CAN: Green waste service has ended for the season. Green cans may be used as an additional garbage can through March. Green service returns in April 2023.

PARK RESTROOMS: Restrooms are closed for the season.
