







CEMETERY SURVEY:RESIDENTS SHARE OPINIONS

For years, residents have shared strong feelings for and against the City building a cemetery in Fruit Heights. A committee of residents was formed to consider needs from the community, projected costs, and other considerations.

A survey about a cemetery was recently presented to residents. The survey was publicized in utility billings, signs around town, on the city website and on social media. Survey questions were reviewed by the cemetery committee and the city council. Open for three weeks, the survey recorded 602 responses.


HONORING VETERANS AT CITY HALL THIS SUMMER





CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

Nicholls Park: City crews are excited to get the ballparks back in shape. New sprinkler lines are going in now, which will be followed by improvements to the hillside and then all new landscaping will go in.

1800 East: Crews began work at the south end of 1800 East, working south, to extend a water line and road. Work has temporarily affected Fruit Loops bike trails, but trails will be repaired. The new road will connect to Bella Vista, a road in Farmington. The project is scheduled to be completed in June. **Chip Seal Work:** This process distributes a thin layer of hot tar and finely graded aggregate onto an existing paved surface. Several streets are set to receive this work this spring, including Cherry Lane and Country Lane. City Hall: Areas of the front porch and patio of the City Hall building have sunk, cracked and are detaching from the building. City Manager, Darren Frandsen, wrote for, and was awarded, a grant to remove the damaged

areas and rebuild the front patio, steps and access ramp. Watch for updates.

FIREWORK SAFETY



As summer kicks off, and the fun parties get going, many of us look forward to fireworks. Fireworks are a fun way to celebrate, but we must all be aware of safety issues and wildfire hazards.

Surrounded by so much vegetation and fuel for fires, restrictions on open fires and fireworks are necessary. Much of our city falls in restricted areas, allowing no discharging of fireworks.
