grew to five rocks. This provides a beautiful home for today's names, plus room to grow for years to come.



DO YOU RENT OUT YOUR HOME?

Do you own a home in Fruit Heights that you rent out? If so, you must fill out a new **Application for City Services**. All property owners, or property management companies, operating rental properties in Fruit Heights must complete a new application by August 15, 2024.

The application can be found at **fruitheightscity.com/294/utility-application**. To prevent disruption in utility services, the new form must be completed by the August 15 deadline. Legal, licensed rental units have received written notice.

CODE ENFORCEMENT REMINDERS

This summer, residents have complained about code violations around the city, including overgrown trees in park strips, weeds and debris in neighboring yards. Reminder, it is the responsibility of residents to maintain property to code. Tree branches must be trimmed to 12' above the street. Sidewalks and lots must be cleared of vegetation and weeds.
