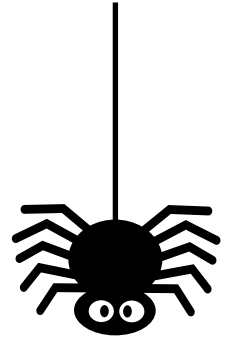


A SPOOKY TRADITION BEGINS

REGISTER TO VOTE

To register, visit vote.utah.gov and click on "Register to Vote". You may also register in person at the Davis County Clerk's Office at 61 S. Main Street in Farmington.

WHEN & WHERE TO VOTE

You may vote by mail, or by using a secure ballot drop box, or in person. Ballots will be mailed to eligible voters starting October 15, 2024.

TO VOTE BY MAIL

(Do **ONE** of the following)
1. Postmark your ballot on or before Monday, November 4. Return postage is provided.

2. Drop your ballot at a secure drop box by 8 pm on Election Day. Drop boxes are located throughout the County, including one in the parking lot of Fruit Heights City Hall at 910 S. Mountain Road.

TO VOTE IN PERSON

An Election Day Voting Center will be located at Fruit Heights City Hall, 910 S. Mountain Road, open from 7 am - 8 pm on election day, Tuesday, November 5. State law requires voters present valid identification to vote at the poll.

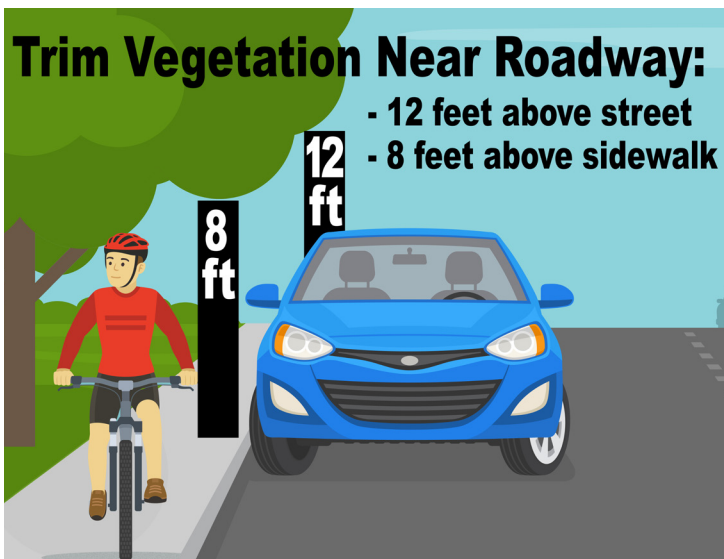
TRIM TREES AHEAD OF WINTER

As colder weather approaches, Fruit Heights Public Works staff wish to remind residents that City Code requires residents to trim all trees and other vegetation near roadways.

These efforts help protect pedestrians by providing a clear line of sight for motorists. It also helps protect street maintenance equipment, and helps facilitate snow removal, garbage collection and mail delivery.

Trim Vegetation Near Roadway:

- 12 feet above street
- 8 feet above sidewalk



Fruit Heights City Code Title 7-1-2 requires tree branches be trimmed to 12' above the street, 8' above sidewalk, and all vegetation should be cleared to behind the curb and sidewalk. This ensures effective service delivery and reduces potential homeowner liability for damage caused.

ATTENTION RESIDENTS: DOWNLOAD CodeRED APP

The Davis County Sheriff's Office has started using the CodeRED emergency notification service. This system is used to alert residents of time-sensitive, emergency/urgent notifications.

In case of emergency, this is the best way to receive timely local information. It is important that residents download the App and register as soon as possible.
