Volunteers Organize Celebration & Food Drive


Sunday, Dec. 15, 6-7:30 pm, Fruit Heights City Hall

WINTER PARKING

From November 1 - April 1, winter parking rules apply regardless of snow on the ground. It is illegal to park on streets between Midnight and 8 am, or during snowfall when plows are in operation.



CodeRED Mobile Alert App

IMPORTANT NOTE: DOWNLOAD CodeRED APP

The Davis County Sheriff's Office has started using the CodeRED emergency notification service. This system is used to alert residents of time-sensitive emergency/urgent notifications such as severe weather, evacuation notices, police activity, missing persons, hazardous materials dangers, boil water advisories, etc.

In case of an emergency, this is the best way to receive timely local information. It is important that residents download the App and register.

CHRISTMAS TREE PICKUP:

Christmas tree pick up day is Friday, Jan. 10, starting at 6 am. **HOLIDAY HOURS:** City Hall will be closed Wednesday, Dec. 25 and Wednesday, Jan. 1.

WINTER PARKING: Winter parking runs Nov. 1 - April 1. No parking on streets overnight, or during snowfall.

GREEN WASTE CAN: Green waste service has ended for the season. Green cans may be used as an additional garbage can through March. Green service returns in April 2025.

PARK RESTROOMS: Restrooms are closed for the season.
