



Coming Soon to a Curb Near You: **BLUE RECYCLE CARTS**

City Adds Recycling Program to Utility Services



Each month, Fruit Heights residents receive a utility bill from the City. Charges cover culinary water, sewer fees, storm drain fees, transportation fees and garbage collection services.

Garbage services are expanding this summer to include a bundle package of one garbage cart and one recycling cart. Curbside recycling will now be part of the standard resident utility package.

KEY POINTS

- In June, a blue recycle cart will be delivered to every home receiving City services. Collection will begin in July.
- Recyclables will be collected every other week on the same day as your garbage.
- The City received a grant to help pay for the recycle carts. Monthly charges pay actual fees for collection.
- The City is proud to participate in this program - helping extend the life of the landfill and protect our environment.

Transportation fee	\$ 7.50
Garbage (1 garbage, 1 recycle)	\$20.50
(Optional) Additional garbage cart***	\$15.50
(Optional) Green waste cart	\$ 7.74
(Optional) Additional recycle cart	\$ 5.00

MINIMUM BILL (without optional cans) **\$120.65**

**Starting July 1, Central Davis Sewer District fees increase from \$38.00 to \$41.00 per month

***Starting July 1, fees for an extra garbage cart increase from \$12.45 to \$15.50 per month

RECYCLE QUESTIONS CONTINUED

Q. WHY BRING A RECYCLE PROGRAM TO FRUIT HEIGHTS?

After many conversations, a community survey and public hearing, members of the city council voted unanimously to bring a recycle program to Fruit Heights.

Q. CAN I OPT OUT OF THE PROGRAM?

No, this is a universal program, meaning it is now a basic service provided by the City, and anyone receiving City services will receive the bundled garbage collection program.

Q. HOW MUCH WILL THE PROGRAM COST?

All residents will now pay \$20.50 for garbage collection services. This includes one garbage cart emptied every week, and one recycle cart emptied every other week. The previous charge was \$15.50 for one garbage cart. This charge was set to go up in July due to a rate increase from Wasatch Integrated Waste. By bundling services, the City was able to secure a lower rate. Residents will now pay the \$20.50 but receive two carts: one garbage, one recycle. Residents choosing to add additional garbage carts will pay \$15.50 per additional cart.

Q. WHAT GOES IN THE CART?



Your new cart will come with information about what can be recycled, including: Plastic bottles/containers, aluminum and steel cans, cardboard (flattened), newspaper, junk mail, paper (all types/colors). **NO GLASS** - There are glass recycling locations located in Kaysville at Barnes Park and the library.



FIREWORK SAFETY



As summer kicks off, and the great parties get going, many of us look forward to fireworks. Fireworks are a fun way to celebrate, but **we must all be aware of safety issues and wildfire hazards.**

Surrounded by so much vegetation and fuel for fires, restrictions on open fires and fireworks are necessary. Much of our city falls in restricted areas, allowing no discharging of fireworks.

Review the restrictions map before setting off any fireworks. The Davis County Sheriff's Office will respond to complaints and violations.
