



Fertilize Thoughtfully:

- Apply when necessary and at minimum amount
- Avoid applying before rain to prevent runoff

Smart Watering

- Avoid overwatering lawns and gardens
- Adjust irrigation based on weather and season

 Sweep driveways and sidewalks to keep debris out of storm drains
